THE GROUNDS

- 607.46 acres
- Two infield ponds

THE GRANDSTAND SIDE

- 127,000 square-foot grandstand
- Capacity of 10,000 – ranging from benches on the apron to luxury sky suite accommodations
- Simulcast theaters – non-smoking and smoking
- 95 wagering stations

SECRETARIAT TURF COURSE

SECRETARIAT

Secretariat is widely considered the greatest American thoroughbred. He was Horse of the Year in both of his seasons on the track, 1972 and 1973, and won the Triple Crown in 1973. Secretariat won 16 of 21 races and \$1,316,808 in purse monies.

The son of Bold Ruler was born at Meadow Farm in Doswell, VA, about 35 miles from Colonial Downs and new home of the State Fair of Virginia in 2009.

SECRETARIAT TURF COURSE

Colonial Downs is best known for the 180 foot wide Secretariat Turf Course, the widest in the nation. With eight different rail settings, the Secretariat Turf Course allows Colonial Downs to card the majority of its races on the turf. Colonial also allows up to 14 starters per race, more than the vast majority of North American tracks. Since turf racing is limited in most of the country, Colonial provides a unique

opportunity for horses of all levels to compete on the turf.

Colonial ran 81 percent of its races on the Secretariat Turf Course in 2007. The course is capable of hosting an even greater percentage, such as the 91 percent in 2002 before the track emphasized a greater diversity in the racing program. In fact, several rainy day cards in 2005

were taken off the dirt and run on the turf!

Races on the Secretariat Turf Course attract full fields – 9.5 starters per race in 2009 for example. Colonial's large number of turf races with full fields provides a unique and often lucrative wagering opportunity for handicappers and an appealing aesthetic for casual fans.

Early nominees are also automatically nominated to the Virginia Derby to be run on Saturday, July 18, 2009. Late nominations for the Colonial Turf Cup close Monday, June 8, 2009 by subscription of \$600 or by Supplementary Nomination of \$25,000 at time of entry (includes entry and starting fees). \$2,500 to pass the entry box and an additional \$2,500 to start, with \$500,000 Guaranteed. After payment of 1% to all owners of horses finishing sixth through last, 60% of the remaining purse shall be paid to the owner of the winner, 20% to second, 11% to third, 6% to fourth, and 3% to fifth. Weight: 123 lbs. Sailor's Cap re-affirmed his affinity for soft turf courses by powering away in upper stretch to drown his opponents in the \$600,000 Colonial Turf Cup (gr. III) Saturday June 21 at Colonial Downs.

Sailor's Cap sliced through a driving rain with a breathtaking four-wide move exiting the turn, engulfing the field in upper stretch and drawing off to an authoritative 6¾-length victory over Nistle's Crunch.

"It was worth it to get soaked like this for that," part owner Nick Benmeir said.

Sailor's Cap's connections were the happiest people in New Kent when the skies opened up around 4:00 p.m. and pounded the Secretariat Turf Course right through Colonial Turf Cup at 5:45 p.m.

"The wetter it got the more we liked it. If you look at his last two races, they were both on yielding tracks and he ran brilliantly," Benmeir said.

Jockey Alan Garcia was equally enthused with the wet weather. "I was confident. He loves that kind of soft turf," he said.

SAILOR'S CAP stalked the pace under patient handling, advanced four wide entering the stretch, swept to command near the three sixteenths pole then eagerly pulled away while kept under encouragement. NISTLE'S CRUNCH, kept in the two path, stalked the pace, advanced outside KENTUCKY BEAR to gain the lead near the quarter pole, was no match for the winner but willingly held the place. YOUR ROUND lacked speed, raced wide entering the backstretch, advanced very wide into the stretch and continued well to rally for the show. COURT VISION lacked speed, raced inside horses on the far turn, eased out near the quarter pole, worked between horses in upper stretch and rallied. ADRIANO lost ground the first turn, advanced three wide, bid for the lead between horses entering the stretch and weakened the final furlong. BALTIMORE BOB raced forwardly inside horses, eased out in upper stretch and weakened. EL SULTRY SUN lacked speed, raced in the three path entering the stretch, angled to the rail in midstretch and failed to sustain his run. SPORTING ART, three wide the first turn, raced wide the far turn and failed to menace. BOSS LAFITTE, very wide the far turn, gave way. KENTUCKY BEAR, quickly clear, set the pace along the rail and gave way in upper stretch.

Sailor's Cap came into the Colonial Turf Cup with two straight strong races on yielding turf courses, an allowance win at Keeneland and a close second to multiple graded stakes winner

Tizdejau in the Crown Royal American Turf (gr. III).

Sailor's Cap raced in mid pack throughout the first three-quarters of the 1 3/16-mile race. Garcia was able to tuck into a two-wide trip after breaking from post position nine as Kentucky Bear opened a clear lead on the front end.

Kentucky Bear was leading in the opening quarter while Sailor's Cap was 11½ lengths off the lead.

At the final turn Garcia tipped Sailor's Cap four wide to launch the winning move.

Sailor's Cap ran the 1 3/16 miles in 2:04.42 over the soft turf. The Colonial Turf Cup win was Sailor's Cap's third from six lifetime starts. The 3-year-old Distant View colt pushed his earnings to \$463,495 with the win.

2007 - SUMMER DOLDRUMS

Summer Doldrums outgamed favored Strike a Deal in a thrilling head to head stretch duel to win the \$750,000 Colonial Turf Cup (gr. III) Saturday June 16, 2007 at Colonial Downs.

Jockey Jose Lezcano worked out a perfect trip for Summer Doldrums. Breaking alertly from post five, Summer Doldrums settled beautifully for Lezcano and was able to tuck into the rail as the field hit the first turn.

Souvenir Slew seized the early lead and was able to relax on a fairly slow pace of 24.31 and 48.84. Mint Slewlep pressed Souvenir Slew while racing two-wide around the first turn. Strike a Deal found a perfect spot on the rail tracking in third, two lengths behind Souvenir Slew in the early going. Summer Doldrums tracked right behind Strike a Deal.

Souvenir Slew kept clicking off 24 second quarters on the lead under Mike Smith while Strike a Deal and Summer Doldrums continued to skim

Lael Stables' Showing Up swept to a 3/4-length victory in the 2006 Colonial Turf Cup. Showing Up ran the 1 3/16 miles over the Secretariat Turf Course in 1:52.98, demolishing Jacsonzac's eight-year-old course record of 1:54.41.

Showing Up went off as the 5-2 favorite in the seemingly wide-open 14-horse field. The Colonial Turf Cup was his first turf try and his first race since finishing sixth in the Kentucky Derby.

Trainer Barclay Tagg expected his star colt to improve on the lawn. "I just never thought he looked real comfortable on the dirt even though he was very impressive on it in several of his races. One day we jogged him off on the turf and he just looked like he was reborn," Tagg said.

Kip Deville broke extremely well from the outside and shot right to the lead. The Kipling colt jumped out to an eight-length lead over Lewis Michael after an opening quarter in :22.54.

Kip Deville kept flying around the

clubhouse turn and opened up an astonishing 15-length lead while setting sizzling fractions of :45.45 for the half and 1:08.61 for three-quarters. Showing Up rated patiently for Cornelio Velasquez in fourth

throughout the early running. Velasquez eased him off the rail around the far turn, and Showing Up cruised up to second, four lengths behind Kip Deville as they straightened for home.

Kip Deville got the mile fraction in 1:34.55 and looked like he would be able to hold on, but Showing Up had him measured. "The last three-eighths I think he win easy," Velasquez said. "I had a lot of horse."

Showing Up leveled off when he switched leads and blew by the pacesetter inside the eighth pole despite drifting out and switching back to his left lead. Kip Deville held on gamely for second, three-quarters of a length ahead of eventual Virginia Derby winner Go Between.

Showing Up added Grade I wins in the Secretariat Stakes and Hollywood Derby to close out his 3-year-old campaign. Kip Deville developed into an exceptional miler with multiple grade I scores, including the 2007 Breeders' Cup Mile and most recently, the 2009 Gulfstream Park Turf Handicap.

COLONIAL TURF CUP

2005 - THE GRAND SLAM DEBUTS - JUNE 25, 2005 -

The \$5,000,000 Jacobs Investments Grand Slam of Grass ushered in a new era for Colonial Downs and for American turf racing when it debuted with the inaugural running of the Colonial Turf Cup on June 25, 2005 at Colonial Downs.

The Grand Slam of Grass put the focus on the long-neglected 3-year-old turf division by offering a multi-million-dollar bonus to any horse that could sweep the Colonial Turf Cup (gr. II), The Virginia Derby (gr. II), the Secretariat Stakes (gr. I) and the Breeders' Cup Turf (gr. I).

James Scaturochio's English Channel exploded in the stretch to post a dominating 3½-length win in the inaugural running of the Colonial Turf Cup before a crowd of 5,064.

English Channel broke well, but jockey John Velazquez got him to relax in third as Mad Adam set an extremely slow pace. "I wanted to get him to relax. That was my sole concentration. I know he can run, so I wasn't worrying about anyone else except my horse," Velazquez said.

English Channel was a half-length behind as Mad Adam ran the opening quarter in 25.08 and the half in 51.02. Velazquez tipped three-wide on the backstretch as the pace quickened and English Channel began to advance on Mad Adam.

The Smart Strike colt made a steady advance on the turn while

English Channel continued to prove himself as an older horse with a trio of grade I wins in 2006 and capped his career with the largest win

in Breeders' Cup Turf history to lock up Champion Turf Horse honors in 2007.

After a patient ride from jockey Tyler Baze and a fast closing kick in the final quarter, Jeff Mullin's Battle of Hastings (GB) landed his nose on the wire to take the \$750,000 Virginia Derby (Gr. II) by a head at Colonial Downs on Saturday.

Despite lacking early speed and travelling five wide around the final turn, the Royal Applause (GB) gelding was able to close the gap through the stretch and finish ahead of Straight Story, repeating the top two finish of the Colonial Turf Cup last month. Both wins at Colonial put Battle of Hastings in the running for the \$5 million-plus Jacobs Investments Grand Slam of Grass Series for 3 year old turf horses. When asked if the gelding would continue on to the third leg, the Secretariat Stakes,

owner Mike House said, "Whatever the horse is doing is what we'll do. But, of course, we should think about it. We won't make any decisions for a week or two." should think about it. We

won't make any decisions for a week or two."

Alan Goldberg's Straight Story, who moved up on the far turn and gained a clear lead entering the stretch, dug in and just missed at the wire for jockey Charles Lopez. "I think everything went right," said Lopez of the race. "I gave him every opportunity to win. The other came and got him. Simple."

Finishing third was Take the Points, a Todd Pletcher trainee who ran fourth in last month's Turf Cup. After bumping Safety Valve while leaving the gate, Take the Points found himself in close quarters under jockey Edgar Prado leaving the far turn and hung at the sixteenth pole.

Lime Rickey, third place finisher in last month's Turf Cup, lacked speed for jockey Cornelio Velasquez and raced six wide before rallying to fourth. Bill Mott's Hold Me Back, who finished twelfth in the Kentucky Derby and had never run on turf, settled early but came up empty in the drive for regular rider Kent Desormeaux.

El Crespo weakened to fifth, while Affirmatif, Safety Valve, and Florentino rounded out the field.

Gio Ponti and Garret Gomez survived a thrilling stretch duel with Court Vision to win the \$750,000 Virginia Derby by a nose in front of 9,061 fans at Colonial Downs.

Gio Ponti and Court Vision began their duel on the far turn, exchanging bumps near the five sixteenths pole. Gio Ponti, racing on the outside, pulled away from Court Vision after the bump and quickly collared the leaders in upper stretch to take command three-sixteenths from the wire.

"Court Vision was actually trying to push his way out in the middle to make some room and I had to use my horse to hold him down inside there," Gomez explained.

Sailor's Cap, the 6-5 favorite, loomed menacingly on the far outside but Court Vision proved to be the main threat once he found room inside of Gio Ponti. Court Vision got to even terms with Gio Ponti at the

eighth pole to spark a torrid duel throughout the final furlong.

"I thought I hung on. You know, it was a very rough run race from about the three-eighths. But, he took it and it was good seasoning for him and hopefully he will keep moving forward," Gomez said.

Gio Ponti ran the 1 1/4 miles in 2:02.22.

Baltimore Bob and Old Man Buck dueled through moderate fractions throughout the first mile, exchanging the lead through splits of :24.78, 49.15, 1:13.91 and 1:38.18. Gio Ponti tracked in third the whole way, racing about two lengths behind the leaders and just ahead of Court Vision for most the race.

Sailor's Cap made a menacing move in upper stretch but never showed the same stretch kick he used to dominate the \$600,000 Colonial Turf Cup (gr. III), settling for third, 2 1/4 lengths behind Gio Ponti.

Gio Ponti scored his fourth win from five starts in the Virginia Derby and boosted his bankroll to \$640,800 for owner Castleton Lyons and trainer Christophe Clement.

Three-time Virginia Derby winning jockey Edgar Prado lost his chance for a fourth Derby score when El Sultry Sun scratched but the champion jockey here in 1997 and 1998 still enjoyed a triumphant return to the New Kent oval with two stakes wins on the Virginia Derby undercard.

Red Giant out-dueled Strike a Deal in a thrilling head to head stretch battle to win the Virginia Derby by a nose.

Red Giant was dismissed at 37-1 as part of a three-horse uncoupled entry for trainer Todd Pletcher but ran like an odds-on favorite, breaking the track record with a 1:59.62 clocking.

Red Giant broke well and settled into a nice stalking trip, racing in the clear in fourth behind pacesetter Inca King for the first mile. Strike a Deal turned up the heat on Inca King on the far turn and was able to get a head in front as they turned for home. Inca King tired and Strike a Deal quickly opened up a 1½-length lead in upper stretch but jockey Horacio Karamanos tipped Red Giant out at the head of the lane and began to slowly wear down Strike a Deal.

Strike a Deal fought back very gamely but Red Giant won the head bob on

Peter Vegso's homebred Go Between rallied strongly to capture the 2006 Virginia Derby, setting a new course record in the process and giving Vegso and trainer Bill Mott their third Virginia Derby win.

Go Between settled into a perfect trip under Garret Gomez. As expected, speedy 2-1 favorite Kip Deville went right to the lead with Roman Dynasty pressing him from the outside. Go Between grabbed the garden spot along the rail in third.

Kip Deville rated much more kindly than he did in the \$1 million Colonial Turf Cup when he opened up 15 lengths through a blazing three-quarters in 1:08 3/5. In the Virginia Derby, Kip Deville set much more reasonable fractions of :24.21, :48.13 and 1:12.11. Roman Dynasty stayed glued to his flank, and Go Between raced two lengths back.

Kip Deville quickened noticeably around the turn and emerged at the top of the lane with a one-length

lead on Roman Dynasty after a mile in 1:35.35. Gomez eased Go Between off the rail, and the Point Given colt responded with a quick burst of speed to take command at the three-sixteenths pole.

Go Between opened up on Kip Deville in midstretch and was never seriously challenged en route to a 1 1/4-length victory in 1:59.74. Seaside Retreat closed well for second,

and Spider Power won a tight photo with Manchu Prince for third.

"It was a good trip, and the horse gave me 100 percent today," Gomez said. "When I asked for him he was right there. When I turned for home, and found my horse somewhere to go, I couldn't believe he made the lead as easily as he did," he said.

Mott and Vegso teamed up to win the 2002 and 2003 editions of the Virginia Derby with full brothers Orchard Park and Silver Tree.

"We pointed for the Virginia Derby last year," Mott revealed after the race. Mott did not make the trip to New Kent for either of his previous victories, but he was present for Go Between's triumph. "I didn't want to miss another one," he said.

Go Between died January 12, 2009 of a heart attack following a 6 furlong workout. For his career, Go Between had \$2.9 million in earnings with eight wins in 27 starts.

2005 - THE GRAND SLAM BEGINS

- JULY 16, 2005 -

The 2005 Virginia Derby took on added significance as the second leg of the inaugural \$5,000,000 Jacobs Investments Grand Slam of Grass.

English Channel won the \$500,000 Colonial Turf Cup for owner James Scatuorchio and trainer Todd Pletcher at Colonial on June 25, 2005, and a Virginia Derby win would keep him alive for the huge bonus.

Jockey John Velazquez kept English Channel closer to the pace than usual in the Virginia Derby. Chattahoochee War went to the lead under Patrick Valenzuela and set reasonable early fractions of 24.99 and 49.96 on a yielding turf course. English Channel raced in second, about a length and a half behind the pacesetter for the first mile.

Velazquez finally allowed English

English Channel widened his advantage with every step and stopped the clock in 2:02.57.

Chattahoochee War held well for second, three-quarters of a length ahead of Bobby Frankel-trained stablemate Rebel Rebel and Jerry Bailey.

English Channel fell short of the Grand Slam, but he more than validated himself with three Grade I wins in 2006 and three more in 2007, culminating in a dominating seven-length win in the \$3,000,000 John Deere Breeders' Cup Turf (gr. I) and an Eclipse Award as Champion Turf Horse of 2007. He was retired to stud in Lexington Kentucky after that "Cup" win.

Ken and Sarah Ramsey's Kitten's Joy drew away from Artie Schiller in the final sixteenth of a mile to win the \$500,000 Virginia Derby (gr. III) on July 10, 2004.

Kitten's Joy was taken well off the early pace by Edgar Prado and enjoyed a ground-saving trip around the first turn. Longshot Jane's Luck sprinted away to set a brisk early pace. Jane's Luck was 3½ lengths in front after an opening quarter in 23.57 and extended to an eight-length lead through a half in 47.30.

Artie Schiller made the first move, swinging two wide around the far turn. Prado immediately took Kitten's Joy off the fence to follow Artie Schiller. Jane's Luck began to back up and the two favorites engulfed him leaving the turn.

Artie Schiller took a short lead at

the top of the lane. Kitten's Joy began to drift out, but Prado was able to keep the El Prado colt on a relatively straight course as they duelled with Artie Schiller.

Kitten's Joy could not shake a very game Artie Schiller until the final sixteenth when Kitten's Joy found another gear and drew off to a 2¾-length victory. Prince Arch closed for third, 7½ lengths behind the winner.

Kitten's Joy ran the 1¼ miles in 2:01.22, shading 23 seconds for the final quarter.

It was the third straight Virginia Derby win for Prado.

Kitten's Joy, trained by Dale Romans, went on to win the Secretariat Stakes and Turf Classic Invitational Stakes before being crowned Eclipse Champion Turf Male.

Artie Schiller became one of the nation's top middle distance turf horses and will forever be remembered as the winner of the 2005 Breeders' Cup Mile. Prince Arch also became a Grade I winner in 2005 with a score in the Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup Turf.

Silver Tree broke alertly from the seven hole and jockey Edgar Prado allowed the Hennessy colt to go to the front. Prado was able to restrain his mount through sensible early fractions of 24.17 and 47.89. Heavy 1-5 favorite Senor Swinger established a perfect stalking trip under Pat Day, racing about 3½ lengths off the pace.

Silver Tree kept clicking off consistent 24-second quarters, maintaining a one-length lead over longshot Hatton Cross through three-quarters in 1:11.83.

Meanwhile, Silver Tree began to extend his lead. Exiting the turn, Prado set Silver Tree down and the colt responded with a spurt to open up a 4½-length lead.

Kicken Kris swung four-wide at the top of the lane to launch a bid, but Silver Tree was long gone. King's Drama went five-wide and closed willingly to finish 1¾ lengths behind Kicken Kris.

Silver Tree's final time of 2:01.11 for the 1¼ miles was two seconds better than Orchard Park's clocking.

Out of the With Approval mare Blue Begum, Silver Tree ran his career record to three wins from four starts with the Virginia Derby win.

Silver Tree has enjoyed a long and successful career featuring multiple graded stakes wins. Silver Tree further cemented his legacy as Hall of Fame jockey Jerry Bailey's final career mount in 2006 and had a splendid campaign in 2008 with a pair of Grade III wins as an 8-year-old.

2002 - A DYNASTY BEGINS

- JULY 13, 2002 -

The fifth edition of the Virginia Derby offered a newly enriched

\$500,000 purse, more than doubling the old value of the race. The resulting field was the shortest and strongest of the first five runnings.

Most of the pre-race speculation centered on Fusao Sekiguchi's Flying Dash and Peter Vegso's Orchard Park.

Orchard Park pulled the mild upset to prevail by 1½ lengths over Flying Dash. Touring England was another 8½ lengths back in third. The final time of a strangely run race was 2:03.10.

Jockey Edgar Prado, who won riding titles at Colonial Downs in 1997

and 1998, gave Orchard Park a superb ride. He allowed the Hennessy colt to settle into fourth in early going. Prado was able to quickly maneuver Orchard Park back to the rail when Kris's Prayer bore out on the clubhouse turn.

Prado then got the jump on his rival with a three-wide move around the far turn and established a 1½-length lead at the top of the stretch. Orchard Park then had plenty of stamina left to withstand Flying Dash's late rally under Victor Espinoza.

VIRGINIA DERBY

2001 - MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM

- JULY 14, 2001 -

The 2001 Virginia Derby was the first held in the summer, a major improvement in its place on the racing calendar. The traditional early October date was in direct competition with the major Breeders' Cup preps, and by October, the best 3-year-olds are usually facing older horses.

The mid-July date positions the Virginia Derby to catch horses from the Triple Crown trail who might be better on turf. That which is exactly what happened in 2001 with Preakness also-ran Bay Eagle.

Second in his only previous start on the turf, Bay Eagle gave a tremendous effort but was out-dued by Potaro in a thrilling stretch drive.

Potaro rated about 3½ lengths off Confucius Say's early pace while Bay Eagle lagged in eighth for the opening half-mile.

Potaro collared Confucius Say in mid-stretch to take a clear lead but Bay Eagle was finally revved up on the far outside and closing with every stride. Potaro dug deep in the final sixteenth to keep that rival at bay while Confucius Say held on for third.

Jockey Brent Bartram guided Potaro to victory. The Catrail colt gave trainer Jonathan Sheppard and owner Augustin Stable their second Virginia Derby victory.

Bay Eagle and fifth-place finisher Unaccountedlea were the first Virginia-breds to run in the Derby.

The 10th Duke of Richmond, Charles Henry Gordon Lennox, was a special guest for the third Derby. The Duke owns Goodwood Racecourse in England, one of the most famous and important race tracks in the world.

The 2000 Virginia Derby broke three early trends of the race's history. The winner, Lightning Paces, was the first non-favorite to win and was the first horse to successfully race near the lead in the Derby.

Breaking from post 12 under Greg Hutton, Lightning Paces tracked just behind Painted Pistol through honest fractions. Lightning Paces dispatched with Painted Pistol to open a clear lead at the top of the stretch and dug in gamely to hold off Sunspot by a nose.

The win keyed the highest mutuels in Derby history. Lightning Paces paid \$30.60 to win. The exacta returned \$472.00, while the trifecta returned a generous \$3,087.40.

VIRGINIA DERBY

1998 - THE INAUGURAL EVENT
- OCTOBER 3, 1998 -

The first Virginia Derby was one of the most successful days in Colonial Downs history. The festivities attracted 8,103 fans, who helped set a record all-source handle of \$2,105,650. In addition to great racing on the newly dedicated Secretariat Turf Course, October 3 was designated "Secretariat Day" by Governor James S. Gilmore, III.

One of the largest crowds in Colonial Downs history was thrilled when 7-5 favorite Crowd Pleaser charged down the lane under Jean-Luc Samyn to win by three lengths.

Crowd Pleaser was owned by George Strawbridge's Augustin Stable and trained by Hall of Famer Jonathan Sheppard. The Derby was the A.P. Indy colt's third straight win.

VIRGINIA DERBY

1999 - RECORD-SETTING RUN - OCTOBER 2, 1999 -

October 2 was designated as "Raymond R. 'Andy' Guest, Jr. Day" by Governor Gilmore. Guest's work in the General Assembly led to the passage of the 1989 law legalizing pari-mutuel wagering in Virginia.

The Derby featured 13 starters, the largest field in the race's history.

Consequently, Phi Beta Doc became the longest-priced Virginia Derby favorite at more than 3-1.

Wheeling back only a week after a rough trip fourth in the 1½-mile Lawrence Realization Stakes at Belmont, Phi Beta Doc was returning to the scene of his first victory. The Doc's Leader colt unleashed a devastating rally from

ninth to win by 1½ lengths, setting the stakes and course record of 1:59.97.

The connections of Phi Beta Doc, owners Dennis Foster and Robert Leonard, trainer Robert Leonard and jockey Ramon Dominguez, also captured the \$75,000 Chenery Stakes with Chancellor M.H. the next race.

Dreaming of Anna, the 2006 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner, proved that she is still on the top of her game with a front running win in the \$200,000 Virginia Oaks.

2009 - **BLIND DATE**
- JULY 18, 2009 -

I Lost My Choo inhaled the quarter-mile stretch run to run down Julia Tuttle and draw clear for a 1½-length victory over Namaste's Wish. Julia Tuttle held well for third, just two lengths behind **I** Lost My Choo.

Dreaming of Anna broke sharply and quickly took her customary position on the lead in the Virginia Oaks. Jockey E.T. Baird was able to get the Rahy filly to relax and slow down the early pace, cutting an opening quarter in 24.13 and the half in 48.08 while maintaining a comfortable 1½-length lead over grade I winner Christmas Kid.

"Speed can be very dangerous and a lot of times they just forget to stop and back up and that seemed like it might be the case at the three-eighths pole. But **I** could see in the stretch that our filly had cut loose and was gaining and the other filly looked like she might be tiring just a little bit," winning trainer Philip Serpe said after the race.

Dreaming of Anna quickened a bit down the backstretch as Christmas Kid moved up to put a little pressure on the pacesetter. Dreaming of Anna got the three-quarters in 1:11.78 and was able to spurt away from Christmas Kid on the turn, and turn for home with a two-length lead.

Flying Zee Stable's **I** Lost My Choo stopped the clock in 1:50.12 to score her first graded stakes victory.

Christmas Kid could not keep up with Dreaming of Anna in upper stretch but a new challenger loomed in the form of 25-1 outsider New Edition, who tipped three-wide to launch a strong rally inside the three-sixteenths pole.

New Edition slowly gained on Dreaming of Anna throughout the final eighth but the champion was resolute in the stretch, holding on to win by a half-length.

Christmas Kid held on well to save third, a length ahead of 2-1 favorite Bit of Whimsy, who finished a non-threatening fourth.

Dreaming of Anna is the second Grade I winner to capture the Virginia Oaks after four editions of the race. Bit of Whimsy joined the list in October 2007 by beating Dreaming of Anna in the \$500,000 Queen Elizabeth II Cup (gr. I) at Keeneland.

2006 - AUNT HENNY

- JULY 15, 2006 -

Erdenheim Farm's Aunt Henny scored a gutsy victory in the \$200,000 Virginia Oaks and set a new stakes record of 1:47.11 for the 1 1/8-mile turf stake.

Aunt Henny went off as the even money favorite in her first race since winning the Herecomesthebride Stakes (gr. III) in March at Gulfstream. The Hennessy filly gave her legions of backers a scare by requiring a photo finish to beat May Night by the narrowest of noses.

May Night revved up on the outside and was flying late to get on equal terms with Aunt Henny in the final strides, but Aunt Henny was resolute for jockey Rafael Bejarano on the rail. Early leader Art Show hung on well for third.

The Virginia Oaks win was the second straight stakes score for Aunt Henny. The Hennessy filly more than doubled her career bankroll to \$223,710 for Erdenheim Farm and trainer Michael Matz.

2005 - MY TYPHOON

- JULY 16, 2005 -

Live Oak Plantation's My Typhoon prevailed in a stirring stretch duel with Masseur to capture the 2005 Virginia Oaks.

My Typhoon and jockey Jerry Bailey opened up a 1½-length advantage over 7-5 favorite Rich in Spirit in upper stretch, but Masseur launched a

strong bid on the outside.

Masseur drew nearly even with My Typhoon near the eighth pole, and those two engaged in a tight duel to the wire with My Typhoon gamely holding on by a neck. Rich in Spirit was third, another 2¼ lengths back. My Typhoon and jockey Jerry Bailey opened up a 1½-length advantage over 7-5 favorite Rich in Spirit in upper stretch, but Masseur launched a strong bid on the outside.

Masseur drew nearly even with My Typhoon near the eighth pole, and those two engaged in a tight duel to the wire with My Typhoon gamely holding on by a neck.

Rich in Spirit was third, another 2¼ lengths back.

My Typhoon ran the 1 1/8 miles in 1:49.63, shading 12 seconds for the final furlong.

The regally bred daughter of Giant's Causeway is a half sister to European champion Galileo.

"She's getting better. She's always had a great pedigree and a



tremendous upside potential,” Bailey said. “Her behavior is starting to let her fulfill her potential. She’s maturing,” he added.

My Typhoon has lived up to that potential and is now a multiple graded stakes winner, including her signature score in the \$500,000 Diana Stakes (gr. I) at Saratoga in July 2007. She was retired after a 13th place finish in the ‘07 Breeders’ Cup Mile.

2004 - ART FAN

- JULY 10, 2004 -

William E. Backer’s Art Fan raced into the history books with an authoritative frontrunning score in the inaugural running of the \$200,000 Virginia Oaks at Colonial Downs.

Art Fan broke alertly under Ryan Fogelsonger, Colonial’s leading rider. Fogelsonger took her to the lead, then coaxed her into a relaxed pace, cutting the opening fractions in :25.58 and :50.58.

As they hit the stretch, Art Fan unleashed a burst of speed to put Vous away and open up a 4½-length lead.

Jockey Edgar Prado sent Galloping Gal after the pacesetter, but the favorite was never a serious threat as Art Fan prevailed by 1¾ lengths. Vous held on for third, another 3¾ lengths back.

Art Fan covered the 1 1/8-miles in 1:50.41. The Lear Fan filly paid \$13.00 as the fourth choice.

Hamilton Smith, Colonial’s all-time leading trainer by purse earnings, conditioned Art Fan.



The \$200,000 All Along Breeders’ Cup Stakes (gr. III) is for fillies and mares, 3-year-olds and up, and is run at 1 1/8 miles on the turf. The All Along Stakes is named after the 1983 Horse of the Year.

Silver Charades dropped back to eighth through the first three-quarters under Jose Valdivia, Jr. and overcame a slow pace to score by 1½ lengths over Humoristic and post her first

2006 - FILM MAKER

- JUNE 24, 2006 -

Courtlandt Farms' Film Maker flew 1 1/8 miles in 1:46.58 to smash the course record and win the All Along for the second time in three years.

Art Fan broke quickly and seized the early lead. Jockey Ramon Dominguez settled Film Maker into fourth along the rail as Art Fan cut the opening quarter in 24.08 and the half in 48.24.

Film Maker continued to save ground around the far turn and was within 4½ lengths of the pacesetter as they straightened for home.

Film Maker launched a devastating rally in the middle of the track and blew the race wide open in the final sixteenth. Latice closed well to take

second and Art Fan held on for third.

Film Maker cut nearly a full second off of the old course record. Kerfoot Corner had held the 1 1/8-mile turf course record of 1:47.40 since 1998.

2005 - STUPENDOUS MISS

- JULY 16, 2005 -

Stupendous Miss scored a resurgent victory that brightened a gray, misty afternoon in the 2005 All Along.

Stupendous Miss shot right to the front under Gary Stevens and opened up a four-length lead through an opening quarter in :24.47. She extended her lead down the backstretch and was six lengths in front after three-quarters in 1:13.84.

Dynamia made a huge move around the far turn to wrest the lead from an apparently tiring Stupendous Miss as the field turned for home.

Stevens swung Stupendous Miss to the outside and the four-year-old Dynaformer filly re-rallied to take the lead inside the sixteenth pole.

Stupendous Miss edged away late for a one-length victory over Humoristic. Dynamia was another neck back in third.

Stupendous Miss ran the 1 1/8 miles on a yielding turf course in 1:51.10.

2004 - FILM MAKER

- JULY 10, 2004 -

Film Maker scored a stylish victory as the 6-5 favorite in the 2004 edition of the All Along.

Film Maker rated patiently under jockey Edgar Prado as Noisette set a crawling early pace of :25.85 and :50.61. Film Maker tracked in fourth while racing along the rail about 3½ lengths behind the early leader.

Prado finally took Film Maker out around the three-sixteenths pole, and the Dynaformer filly exploded in the lane to leave her rivals behind.

Film Maker drew off to win by three lengths over Noisette. Lady Linda was third. The final time for the 1 1/8 miles was 1:50.08. Film Maker paid \$4.40.

A Grade I winner in 2003, Film Maker capped a fine 4-year-old season with a second behind champion Ouija Board in the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare turf.

Once reloaded, Dress to Thrill broke sharply and went right to the front. Jockey Egdar Prado was able to slow the Danehill filly down to a leisurely early pace of :25.04 and :49.17. Dress to Thrill maintained a length lead through six furlongs in 1:12.38, but her pre-race efforts appeared to be taking a toll as Golden Corona loomed on her outside. Dress to Thrill held a half-length advantage over Golden Corona as they hit the top of the stretch.

Dress to Thrill began to drift out badly, but dug in to gamely hold off Lady Linda's late challenge by a half-length. Lady of the Future closed well for third, another length back. The final time was 1:49.16.

2002 - SECRET RIVER
- JULY 14, 2002 -

Secret River recorded her first graded stakes win in the 2002 All Along. She finished resolutely to hold off a late closing bid from heavy favorite Golden Corona by a head after 1 1/8 miles in 1:50.76.

The win was the biggest of the meet for leading jockey Horacio Karamanos, trainer Lawrence Murray and owner-breeder Sondra Bender.

2001 - COLSTAR
- JULY 14, 2001 -

Grade I winner Colstar was the heavy favorite for the 2001 All Along. Under jockey Jon Court, she did not disappoint, posting a three-length victory and tying the track record of 1:47 2/5.

Owned by Beverly Steinman, Colstar achieved millionaire status with her All

Along score. Unfortunately, it was also her final race as the Paul Fout trainee was injured while preparing for the Breeders' Cup.

2000 - IDLE RICH
- OCTOBER 7, 2000 -

The 2000 renewal of the All Along was run at 1 3/16 miles and marked the return of the fixture after a one-year absence. The race drew a powerhouse three-horse entry of Idle Rich, Krisada and Emanating. Bill Mott trained Idle Rich while Shug McGaughey conditioned the other two. Bettors sent the trio off as the 3-2 choice.

Jockey Aaron Gryder sent Idle Rich right to the front and the Sky Classic mare opened up a clear lead while clicking off consistent quarters of :24 and change. Idle Rich had plenty of stamina left in the stretch to prevail by one length over a late closing Emanating.

1998 - BURSTING FORTH
- OCTOBER 3, 1998 -

Bursting Forth scored a popular victory in the first edition of the All Along contested at Colonial Downs.

Bursting Forth was owned by NFL legend Sam Huff, an avid horse racing fan who has been a driving force in the West Virginia racing industry and co-host of a radio program dedicated to the sport.

Bursting Forth covered the 1 1/8 miles in 1:48.01 under leading rider Edgar Prado.

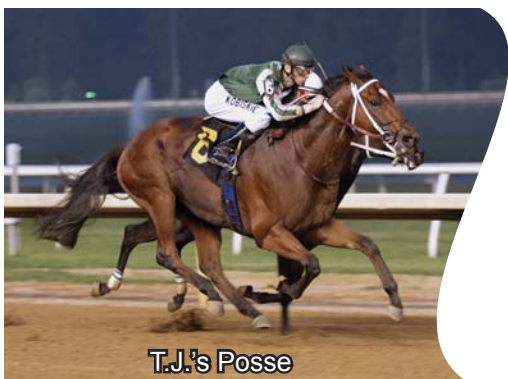

STEEPLECHASE RACING

Steeplechase racing was considered part of the Colonial Downs plan from the outset. The jumping version of Thoroughbred racing has long been a tradition in the Commonwealth, with some 10 National Steeplechase Association events and numerous point-to-points. In addition, some of the sport's leading owners, trainers and jockeys call Virginia home.

In 1998, Colonial Downs hosted 10 steeplechase races spread over four days in September and October. On September 13, Crest Of The Wave won the track's first hurdle race in a photo finish for jockey Sean Clancy. Eventual 1998 Eclipse Award winner Flat Top won the inaugural Zeke Ferguson Memorial on October 4.

Colonial's steeplechase plan provides the ideal stepping-stone to the Saratoga steeplechase season with a schedule built around quality maiden and early allowance races.

The annual highlight of Colonial's steeplechase schedule is the \$50,000 David L. "Zeke" Ferguson Memorial (NSA-III).

Slip Away stepped up in company and scored his most impressive

With Preemptive Strike out, Slip Away had no other competition for the early pace, and the six year old Skip Away gelding easily got to the front and opened by as many as fifteen lengths at the halfway point of the race.

"I didn't expect to be that far out in front," said rider Chip Miller. "The hardest part was trying to gauge where the other horses were. Normally, you can hear the hooves of the trailing horses as they land right after the jump, but I couldn't hear them today."

Though Slip Away's margin did diminish to five lengths in the stretch, he bore down as the field grew closer and maintained that lead to the finish in gaining his first stakes win. The victor is trained by Thomas Voss and is owned by Kenneth and Sarah Ramsey, who also owned former Virginia Derby winner Kittens Joy. Ironically, the \$50,000 Kittens Joy Stakes is part of the '09 Derby under card this coming Saturday. The winner returned \$5.80.

Mixed Up, a Jonathan Sheppard trainee whose \$600,000-plus bankroll topped the field, finished second, while Swagger Stick was third for trainer Jack Fisher.

HORACIO KARAMANOS



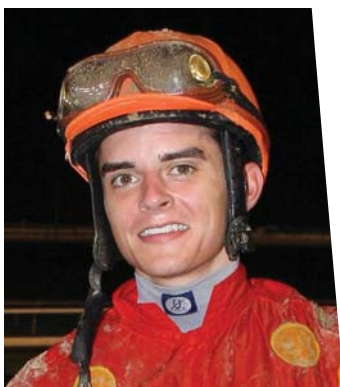
Horacio Karamanos began working with horses as a groom at 14 in his native Argentina. On October 28, 1991, he won the first race he rode, on a horse named Nicoleta at San Isidoro. He rode a total of 1,675 races over a decade in Argentina. Early in the 2002 season Horacio earned the nickname “Special K” with a number of outstanding rides in a season that culminated with the riding title and a Colonial record for earnings at \$1,022,039. He broke his own record for earnings with a historic 2005 campaign that included a record 66 wins that he came back in 2008 to repeat. Karamanos is Colonial’s all-time leading jockey by both wins and earnings and holds the single season marks in both categories. He scored the biggest win of his career in the 2007 Virginia Derby aboard Red Giant.



ROSEMARY B. HOMEISTER, JR.



Riding at an early age, Rosemary has spent most of her life around horses. Beginning her racing career at Calder Race Course in 1992 she became the first female jockey to win the Eclipse Award for Outstanding Apprentice Jockey. Continuing her career until 2004, Rosemary continued to receive honors. In 2004 she retired for 18 months to pursue Real Estate Sales, later returning to horse racing still receiving honors. In 2009 Rosemary came to Colonial Downs winning 3 stakes races and 48 other races earning her the title “2009 Leading Rider” at Colonial Downs, also obtaining the honor of 2nd Leading Female Jockey of all time with 2,138 wins and counting.



SHELDON RUSSELL

Born in Louisiana, Russell began his riding career in New Market, England attending a racing school there and having a dozen mounts including his first career win in July 2005 at Catterick, England. He then returned to the United States. Sheldon began racing at Colonial Downs for the 2008 thoroughbred meet generating 14 wins of his 77 mounts placing him in 11th place for the meet. He returned in 2009 to stand as Leading Apprentice Jockey and the 2nd leading rider of the meet.



GEOVANY GARCIA

Geovany Garcia, younger brother of Luis Garcia, graduated from the famed jockey school of Eddie Belmonte. Geovany was the 3rd leading jockey of the 2009 Colonial Downs summer thoroughbred meet. He won a total of 30 races including the Chesapeake Stakes aboard Ah Day and came in the money on another 63 races.

LUIS GARCIA

Luis Garcia scored his first career win at El Commandante on Christmas Day 2002. His first domestic win came with Press Your Luck at Charles Town on March 8, 2003 and was the 2nd leading apprentice rider by wins in North America that year. In 2006 Garcia took the Colonial Downs title of Leading Jockey. He has continued every year since then to remain in the top 5 riders at Colonial.



MALCOM FRANKLIN

Beginning his full time riding career at Colonial Downs in 2006 and riding part time in 2005, Malcom Franklin broke his maiden aboard trainer Hamilton Smith's The Bohemon. Each year since his debut, Franklin has made his way to the top ten jockeys, with his best finishes for the Colonial Downs meet in 2007 and 2008, finishing 2nd and 3rd respectively. In the past 4 years riding at Colonial Downs full time, Malcom has accumulated over \$1,624,271 and 94 wins.



JONATHAN JOYCE

Jonathan Joyce was raised in a racing family. Jonathan's father was a rider in his native Panama and his mother worked in the mutuel department at the major New York tracks. In the past 4 years of racing at Colonial Downs including a short year in 2008, Joyce has accumulated over \$1,284,179 and 73 wins.

AUSPICIOUS START

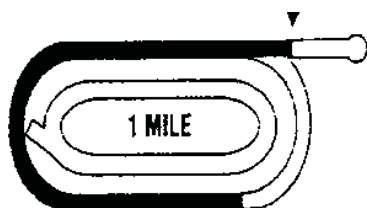
Harness racing made its Colonial Downs debut in 1998, one year after the thoroughbreds began. That initial campaign featured 42 race programs, 255 new life marks, five sub 1:50.0 miles and the second fastest mile of all time. Standardbred action in Virginia quickly became most worthy of attention.

The inaugural campaign began brilliantly as Pacific Fella captured the \$50,000 Graduate Stake in a sizzling 1:48 2/5 on opening night, second fastest mile of all time and a sign of “speedy” things to come.

ONE TURN MILE

It used to be that a “two-minute mile” was the benchmark of a pacer or trotter’s success in harness racing, but Colonial Downs’ unique track configuration and the resulting mile times made that benchmark antiquated. Horses at Colonial Downs start out of a chute on the backstretch, pace or trot in a half-mile straightaway, maneuver through a quarter-mile turn, then finish with a quarter-mile stretch drive.

This unique track layout allows horses to have plenty of time to settle into position without giving

up precious ground, resulting in more truly run races.

REDEFINING SPEED

Harness racing’s only “one-turn” mile racetrack produced a startling 255 new lifetime speed marks for winning horses that competed in the track’s 382 races that first year. In mid-May, 39 consecutive winners either established or tied new lifetime speed marks. On May 10th, a five-year-old Falcon Seelster pacer named Ultimate Falcon nearly rewrote the history books for speed but fell one tick shy in a \$20,000 “Open Handicap” race. Ultimate Falcon’s remarkable clocking of 1:47 4/5 was the second fastest mile of all time (beating Pacific Fella’s), just one-fifth of a second behind Jenna’s Beach Boy’s 1:47 3/5.

In fact, so many records were established due to the one-turn mile that the United States Trotting Association (USTA) created a special category in their “World Record” section of the annual “Trotting & Pacing Guide”

for horses that competed at Colonial Downs. In addition to all-time marks for horses that compete on either a half-mile oval, five-eighths mile track or mile track, there is a new one whose header reads “Tracks Greater Than A One Mile Distance.” Since Colonial Downs is the only track whose oval is “Greater Than One Mile,” all Colonial records are technically “World Records.”

A UNIQUE TRACK

Harness handicappers have always looked closely at horses that draw inside post positions -- until Colonial Downs opened in '98, that is. Horses that left from the rail (post position one) captured only 40 of 382 races that first year, the worst of any post position!

That post position equality has continued throughout the years at the one-turn mile. In 2005, post two had the most winners at a 14.9 percent clip, but post seven was right behind with 14.6 percent. In 2006, post nine was best at 16.3 percent. Post nine was best again in 2007 with 15.6 percent winners.

PATRIOT

INVITATIONAL

Colonial Downs has long been the site of World Record performances, but the one-turn mile lacked a signature harness race in recent years. The inauguration of the \$100,000 Patriot Invitational Trot in 2006 more than filled any gaps in the schedule.

2008 - ENOUGH TALK - OCTOBER 11, 2008 -

Enough Talk became the first trotter in harness racing history to break the 1:50 barrier with a dominant 1:49.3 score in the \$100,000 Patriot Invitational Saturday night at Colonial Downs.

Enough Talk swept to the lead in upper stretch and simply cruised home for driver Ron Pierce to win by 8 1/2-lengths over two-time defending Patriot champion Vivid Photo.

The record clocking was set up by wicked early fractions from Instant Photo and Vivid Photo. Instant Photo was quickest off the gate to lead the field through an opening quarter in 26.2 but Vivid Photo and driver Yannick Gingras were intent on the lead, seizing control near the end of the long Colonial backstretch.

Vivid Photo led the field into the turn, getting the opening half in 53.4. Lanson raced just behind the leader



with Instant Photo in third and Enough Talk 4 1/4 lengths back in fifth for driver Ron Pierce.

Lanson made the first move on the turn, passing Vivid Photo on the outside to lead after three-quarters in 1:21.3. Pierce guided Enough Talk to the far outside in upper stretch and the 5-year-old Enjoy Lavec gelding inhaled the field in just a few strides.

Enough Talk was 1 1/4-lengths clear of a resurgent Vivid Photo at the eighth pole and simply widened his advantage under minimal encouragement from Pierce.

Green Day closed from last to get third, a half-length behind Vivid Photo.

Donato Hanover and Giant Diablo both trotted miles in 1:50.1 to share the previous fastest mark.

Enough Talk's Patriot Invitational win was his sixth score of the season and 23rd lifetime. The \$50,000 winner's share boosted his lifetime earnings to \$948,091 for co-owners P Kleinhans Racing Inc. and Jerry Silva. Peter Keinhans trains Enough Talk.

Vivid Photo's second place finish netted the two-time Dan Patch award winner \$25,000, enough to become the sixteenth North American standardbred to reach \$3 million in career earnings. The S J's Photo gelding has bankrolled \$3,011,558 for co-owners Roger Hammer and Todd Schadel.

FIRST RATE

- 3 YO COLT AND GELDING PACE -



First Rate set a new track and world record for the second straight year to win the 3-year-old colt and gelding pace Virginia Breeders Final and highlight the Virginia Harness Day of Champions Saturday at Colonial Downs.

First Rate's 1:49 clocking in the \$43,600 Final easily bested Speakeasy's 1:50.1 that had set the standard for 3-year-old gelding pacers. First Rate paced a mile in 1:50.2 to win the 2-year-old Virginia Breeders Final and set the 2-year-old gelding standard last season at Colonial.

Pot Luck Stable's First Rate raced in second Saturday, intently tracking Boss Outlaw's blistering early pace in the Final. Boss Outlaw paced the opening quarter in 25.3 and got the half in 53.3 with First Rate racing in the pocket.

Driver Tim Curtin sent First Rate after the leader nearing the end of the turn, getting to within a quarter-length of the frontstepper after three-quarters in 1:22.1.

Boss Outlaw had plenty left for the 1300-foot stretch but First Rate was just too good, pacing a 26.4 final quarter to draw off to win by 2 ½ lengths over Boss Outlaw.

Blueridge Finance closed well to get third, another 2 ¾ lengths back.

The win was First Rate's tenth from 29 lifetime starts. The Real Artist gelding pushed his lifetime bankroll past \$165,000 for trainer Samuel Beegle.

KOALA KAT

- 3 YO FILLY TROT -

Jane P. Dunavant's Koala Kat didn't break any records Saturday but she was arguable just as impressive as First Rate with her 2 ¼ length score in the \$46,600 3-year-old Filly Trot Final.

Koala Kat rated patiently in third for driver Chris Page as second choice Pretty May Flowers opened up a four length lead on the turn. Page tipped Koala Kat out at the top of the lane and the Cr Commando filly inhaled the leaders with a powerful stretch rally to stop the clock in 1:53.1.

Pretty May Flowers held well for second, 9 ¾ lengths clear of third place finisher Dreamanda. Dreamanda was disqualified and placed fourth behind Little Star Becca for a lapped on break at the wire.

Koala Kat picked up her fifth lifetime victory and boosted her bankroll to \$81,120 for trainer Roland C. Dunavant, Jr.



FOUR STARZ HORNDOG

- 3 YO FILLY PACE -

Four Starz Horndog lived up to

her 1-2 odds with a gate-to-wire score in the \$48,500 3-year-old Filly Pace Finals. Four Starz Horndog paced the mile in 1:52 beat Minnesota Mary by a length with Southern another 3 ½ lengths back in third.

BREEDERS CROWN



In November 1998, the sport's top two- and three-year-old pacers and trotters invaded Virginia to compete in the \$3.5 million Breeders Crown Championships, sponsored by the Virginia Tourism Corporation. Eight elite divisions battled in front of a national ESPN television audience and further exposed harness racing fans to Colonial Downs.

EIGHT WORLD RECORDS SET

Eight Breeders Crown Finals were contested on November 14, 1998, at Colonial Downs. As expected, all eight winners established new track and world records.

Four Breeders Crown winners were named champions in 1998 – Muscles Yankee, Artiscap, Galleria and CR Commando. Muscles Yankee's 1:53.0 mile stood as the fastest mile trotted at Colonial Downs until Kim's Lass sizzled home in 1:52.1 on Halloween 2004.

The 1998 winners continue to make their mark on harness racing today. Muscles Yankee led the sire list in 2004 and 2005 and is clearly one of the elite trotting sires in the world. Artiscap and Badlands Hanover are annually among the top pacing sires.

Created in 1980, Advanced Deposit Wagering or Account Wagering enabled racing fans to wager from home by setting up an account at a racetrack and calling wagers into a telephone call center. As computer technology and the internet developed, ADW was made available through personal computers. A player simply sets up an account, proves his identity and state of residency and deposits funds into the account. As soon as an account is open, a customer can begin wagering by entering his assigned account number and chosen PIN into the system. As the player wagers, funds are taken out of the account and winning wagers are credited to the account. There are various methods of depositing and withdrawing funds. With the availability of video-streaming, players can now watch races on their computers from all over the United States and around the world.

Advance Deposit Wagering was embraced by Colonial Downs in 2004 under the name of EZ Horseplay enabling Virginia racing fans to wager via the telephone or computer. EZ Horseplay is licensed and regulated by the Virginia Racing Commission. The EZ Horseplay account wagering system is a secure, closed-loop internet based system that can only be accessed by the participants' individually-assigned account number and secret personal identification number (PIN)

NEW KENT

THE FIRST LADIES

The first First Lady was born in New Kent at Chestnut Grove. Martha Dandridge was born on June 2, 1731.

Martha Dandridge was the daughter of John Dandridge, the Clerk of Courts in New Kent for 26 years. John Dandridge was also a

vestryman and churchwarden in St. Peter's Parish. Martha met Daniel Park Custis at St. Peter's, and they were married there in 1750. They resided at the White House plantation in New Kent until

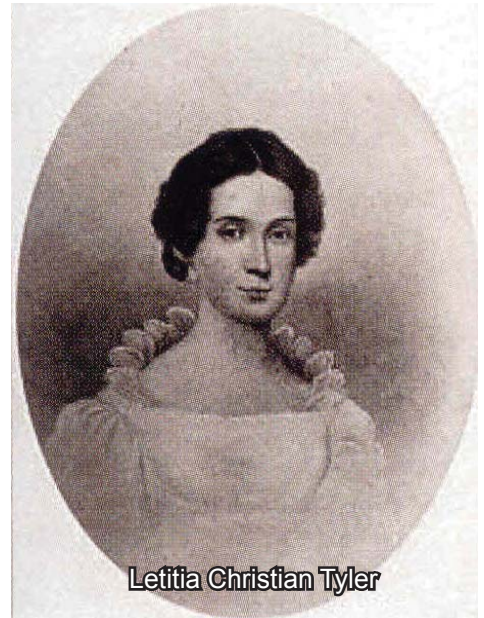
Custis' death in 1758.

In 1758 the newly widowed Martha met then Col. George Washington at Poplar Grove. They were married on January 6, 1759. The location of the ceremony is still a mystery. Martha's grandson wrote that the wedding took place in the White House, but years later Gen. Robert E. Lee, the husband of Martha's great-granddaughter, wrote that the wedding was held at St. Peter's when the church was in danger.

New Kent is also home to the tenth First Lady of the United States, Letitia Christian Tyler. Letitia Christian was born at Cedar Grove in New Kent in 1790. Her father, Robert

Christian, was a colonel in the New Kent Militia and served in the General Assembly.

Letitia Christian married John Tyler in 1812. Tyler was elected president in 1840. Letitia Tyler died in 1842 and was buried at Cedar Grove where her gravesite still remains in a brick-walled

cemetery just a short distance from the old house.

TODAY

New Kent's roads leading from Richmond to Williamsburg are among the oldest in America. Over them have marched French, British, Revolutionary, Confederate and Union armies.

In 1998 the New Kent Historical Society restored the old jail at New Kent Courthouse as a museum and depository for county historical artifacts. Contact the Society at P. O. Box 24, New Kent, VA 23124 for more information.

THE BIRTH

New Kent is one of the oldest and most charming counties in Virginia, and was first mentioned in the records of the General Assembly in the year of 1654.

The New Kent area was home to a thriving Native American civilization when Spanish explorers first came to these shores in the 1500s. The Indians numbered between 14,000 and 21,000 and were loosely organized into 150 villages ruled by a leader known as the "Powhatan."

Colonial exploration of New Kent began in 1609 when Captain John Smith began to explore the Chickahominy river. Smith was captured by the native people but was able to establish a good relationship with the Powhatan, Wahunsunacock, through his daughter Pocahontas.

The colonists and the Native Americans co-existed fairly well until the death of Pocahontas in 1617 and Wahunsunacock in 1618. An intermittent war soon followed and by 1646 the great native confederacy fell apart.

The settlers were of English stock and the county was named for Kent in England. Land grants to the early settlers along the rivers led to large plantations and palatial manor houses, fostering a way of life long associated with our colonial era. Although many of the homes remain, none are regularly open to the public.

New Kent once formed part of Charles River County, one of the eight shires into which the colony

of Virginia was divided in 1634. Originally including part or all of the present-day counties of King & Queen, King William, Spotsylvania, and Hanover, the modern day borders of New Kent were established in 1766 through exchange of land with James City County.

The European History of New Kent began with the visit of Captain John Smith in 1607. The English were feasted by the Indians, and Smith got several hundred bushels of corn for a few blue beads, representing them as only to be worn by great kings.

Brick House, founded in 1680, was the first town in New Kent. At the time of Bacon's Rebellion in 1676, Brick House was already a place of importance and the seat of the county courts. The New Kent County Clerk at the time, Thomas Hall, who supported Bacon, was hanged for his participation in the rebellion.

In 1748, Cumberland, a colonial town on the south side of the Pamunkey River, came within three votes of replacing Williamsburg as the capital of the Virginia colony after the Williamsburg Capitol building was burned.

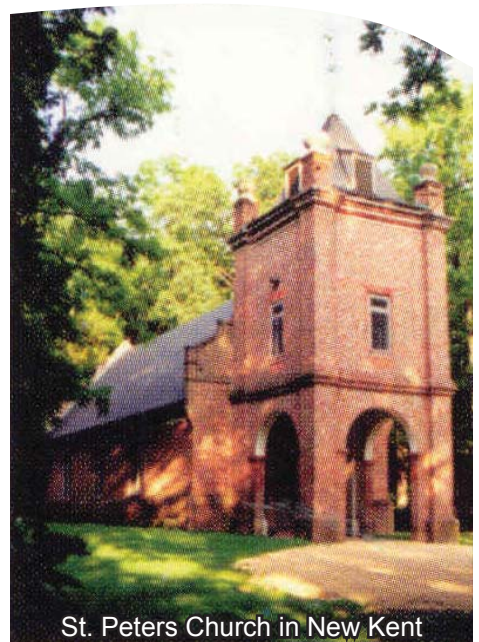
There is a legend that the cannons belonging to the New Kent militia were thrown into the Pamunkey River at Cumberland during the American Revolution. Their purchase at New Kent Courthouse and transportation to Cumberland are a matter of record, but their being pushed into the river cannot be confirmed.

The village of New Kent appears

to have been the county seat since 1691. Most of the county's colonial records were destroyed in the burning of the clerk's office in 1787, and later records were destroyed in the burning of Richmond during the Civil War.

Providence Forge was one of the earliest settlements and the site of a colonial forge that was destroyed by Banister Tarleton in the Revolutionary War. Even its location was forgotten until uncovered by the great flood of 1868.

St. Peter's Church at Talleyville was established in 1678 and built in 1701. It was enlarged in 1740 by the addition of a tower and vestry room and in the 1760s by the building of a north wing, believed to have been torn down in 1854. Martha Dandridge Custis, who lived in White House on the Pamunkey, worshiped here at the time of her marriage to George Washington.
